

Key Steps for Implementing the 2019 CPMS

Assess and Contextualise

- To understand and build upon previous work to roll out the CPMS in your context
- To make the content of the standards appropriate and meaningful to the context

Raise Awareness

- To encourage buy-in from key actors to apply the CPMS
- To gather support from government and humanitarian actors to promote and implement the CPMS

Build Capacities

- To support international and national actors to adopt new approaches in the 2019 CPMS

Institutionalise and Monitor Application

- To improve quality, predictability and accountability of child protection and integrated, multisectoral approaches in humanitarian action

Key Actions

- ✓ Fill out the Assessment Checklist within your agency or as an inter-agency coordination group
- Hold a national contextualisation workshop or use the Contextualisation Checklist to build on previous work
- Ensure national and local actors play a leading role in the process
- Identify opportunities for collaborating with other sectors/ clusters, government partners and development actors

Key Actions

- ✓ Translate the CPMS and/ or CPMS Summary version into local languages if needed
- ✓ Hold a launch event, targeted briefings or webinar at the national and sub-national levels
- Key targets: Humanitarian agencies, government actors, other sector clusters/ coordination groups and senior humanitarian leaders
- ✓ Outcome: A follow-up plan for key steps to implement the CPMS
- ✓ Awareness raising can take place simultaneously with other steps

Key Actions

- Prioritise capacity-building events on new standards and approaches that meet contextual needs
- ✓ Use the following training packages to support in-person or online capacity building:
 - Frontliner's Training Package
 - Face-to-Face Training Package
 - CPMS E-Course
- Include staff from other sectors and clusters in key trainings
- Ensure the equal participation of national and local actors
- ✓ Update capacity-building plans based on identified needs in the standards

Key Actions

- Revise inter-agency response plans and agency-specific child protection strategic plans and work plans to reflect key actions, indicators and notes of contextualised standards
- Use the standards to advocate and fundraise for child protection in the context
- Hold national and sub-national trainings on the contextualised standards for all child protection actors, especially national and local actors
- Use the contextualised indicators in inter-agency and agency-specific monitoring and evaluation plans
